About NSDF

NSDF exists to create new art, new artists and new communities.

In recent times the organisation has reorganised and renewed. It is open to all 16-25 year olds.

Through NSDF CREATES we are now creating work and communities from scratch. Everything we have done in the last year has been free and open to all. We hope it's an exciting time to be part of our work.

Although NSDF is now a year round organisation, the Festival is at the core of our work. Brilliant work created by 16-25 year olds from all over the UK is presented to an audience of young people, professionals and public. - We have a Festival magazine called <u>Noises Off</u> with young people who apply for places on the editorial team
- We have a <u>Technical Team</u> and <u>Management Team</u> made up of young people who apply for places and help us produce the Festival week

Job Description - Technical Director

Reporting to: NSDF Director

General

- The Technical Director is a fixed fee, freelance post.
- The Technical Director leads a professional Technical Team who have a variety of skills and experience in all aspects of technical theatre.
- The successful candidate will have demonstrable, all round experience and knowledge of technical theatre. Knowledge and experience of rigging and construction of temporary venues within larger buildings is important, as well as a good understanding of current Health and Safety requirements and industry standards.
- An empathy and a passion for the principles of NSDF, from inclusion to practicality, (full list of Principles attached with this pack).
- A calm and supportive nature allied to a wish to teach, advise and support young people is essential.
- Alongside this NSDF has achieved significant success and attention with their two fully digital Festivals created during the pandemic. Ideally our new Technical Director will possess skills which will help us, when we return to a live Festival in 2022, to continue including a significant digital element to our work: expanding our reach.
- The Festival has excellent relationships with several Technical Suppliers who sponsor us in kind. Our new Technical Director will be required to carefully manage these relationships and look for other possible sponsorship arrangements.

Structuring the Technical Team

- The Technical Director will- alongside the Director- lead the recruitment and organisation of the Technical Team for Festival 22, structuring to meet the priorities of the new NSDF.
- NSDF is looking for an individual with the drive, knowledge, contacts and shared values to lead the Technical Department into the future. We envision this particular process taking place over a week in November 2021.

Duties and Responsibilities

The Technical Director's responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Recruitment and structuring of NSDF Professional Technical Team, in consultation with the Director.
- Line management of NSDF Professional Technical Team.
- Selection of the volunteer student Technical Team (usually around 60 people).
- Appointment of senior student roles, including Stage Managers and Technical Stage Managers.
- Leadership and management of the student Technical Team at the Festival supported by the professional Technical Team.
- Implementation of health and safety requirements and first aid training as required.
- Production scheduling for the shows and all events.
- Scheduling and planning of the technical workshops in liaison with the Director and the Core Team.
- Controlling the technical budget as set by the NSDF Director (CEO).
- Liaising with the Core Team and Associates on all necessary aspects of the Festival.
- Technical liaison with, and support of, the companies who's shows are coming to the Festival.
- Technical liaison with venues in Leicester where Festival Events will take place.
- Technical liaison with Visiting Artists, Sponsors and Suppliers as required.
- Technical support and technical creative ideas for the late night events and any other events throughout the week.

- Organise the hiring or purchase of all technical equipment as required.
- Acquire specialist equipment for other NSDF events or workshops as required.
- Arrange transport and equipment logistics as required.
- Oversee the get out to ensure all returns are made to sponsors and hire suppliers. (The
 Festival ends on Good Friday and often collection and trucking of equipment happens on the
 Tuesday after the Easter Monday Bank Holiday).
- Implement the NSDF Technical Team Health and Safety policy, Equal Opportunities Policy and Equality Action. Plan and ensure that all the Technical Team adhere to all NSDF Policies. Ultimate responsibility for all NSDF policies lies with the Director.
- Create and maintain a safe and inclusive environment.
- Ensure that the experience of the young people who come to NSDF is of the highest possible standard.
- Prior to appointment, the TD will be required to undergo a standard legal check (DBS), in accordance with the NSDF Young Person's Protection Policy.

NSDF is a registered charity and an Arts Council England National Portfolio Organisation.

Timeline

- November 2021: Recruitment and structuring of Technical Team.
- **February 2022:** Pieces of work chosen for NSDF 22. Full Festival preparations begin, in liaison with the Core NSDF Team.
- April 9-15 2022: The Annual Festival.

Fee

The Technical Director will be contracted by NSDF on a fixed fee of £4,500, paid in instalments, with the first instalment to cover work done recruiting the Technical Team, alongside the Director.

The Technical Director is provided with single occupancy accommodation for the duration of the Festival and we provide lunch and dinner every day from the Friday ahead of the Festival to the last day of the Festival inclusive. NSDF provides accommodation and train travel as required for necessary NSDF business.
